

WHAT IS ASL?








- American Sign Language (ASL) is a visual language.
- ASL is not a universal language- each country has its own sign language and regions have dialects, much like the many languages spoken all over the world.
- ASL is used predominantly in the United States and in many parts of Canada.

WHICH HAND?



- Use your dominant hand. If you are right handed, use the right hand to sign (one-hand sign) or fingerspell. Same for lefty.
- Non-dominant hand considered stationary hand.
 - WORK
 - LEARN
- When signs are symmetrical, use both hands in the same movement.
 - TEACH
 - PLAY


